

Case Study: From Crisis to Independence

J arrived at Maybanke Accommodation and Crisis Support Service after being referred through another DV support agency after fleeing Domestic Violence. J was born overseas and so has limited English skills and was supported with engaging interpreters where needed, especially with legal documents.

J was supported with a successful application for a Domestic Violence Order through the courts with a clause that allowed her to retrieve her belongings. Maybanke also supported J with transport and retrieval of her belongings. In addition, she was supported with a successful application for Permanent Residency on the grounds of Domestic Violence through RAILS (Refugee and Immigrant Legal Services) and the Department of Immigration.

Maybanke also assisted her with an appointment to see a GP where she was able to access psychologist appointments through a Mental Health Plan.

J was supported with an application for Property Settlement and referred to Women's Legal Services. Maybanke will continue to support her through this process.

J is now able to work and has secured a part-time job which has enabled her to become more independent and in control of her own life.

J was assisted with transitioning from Maybanke into private rental where she is close to work and support systems and said she feels ready to live independently and move onto the next step of her journey of empowerment.
